# IAYO Youth Orchestra Achievement Awards 2016

The aim of the awards is to acknowledge particular achievements by IAYO member Youth Orchestras during the calendar year 2016 which have contributed significantly to the development of these orchestras.

### Awards Categories

**Development of the Youth Orchestra:** This award recognises the efforts of member orchestras in promoting the growth and development of their orchestras through any number of means such as drives to recruit and retain members, increasing the range and balance of instruments in the orchestra, developing new ways of funding the orchestra, including access programmes etc.

**Special Achievement Award:** This award is intended for innovative achievement that benefits a single youth orchestra, or the entire community of youth orchestras. Artistic projects or youth orchestra tours that are in some way imaginative or different, or represent a great achievement for a particular orchestra will be considered here.

Each award carries a prize fund of €500. IAYO reserves the right to make a joint or split award in the case where we wish to acknowledge two orchestras for their activities. In such a case, each orchestra will receive €250.

Applications are not required to be for a specific category and judges have the option to choose which category an application fits in to. All achievements will be considered in light of the age and level of development of a particular orchestra.

#### **Conditions of Entry**

- Applicants must be IAYO members and must have paid their membership fee for 2016 2017.
- Projects must have been in operation or completed in 2016.
- The application should be typed. Additional materials may be submitted.
- Member orchestras that have been presented with an IAYO Achievement Award at Festivals between 2014 to 2016 inclusive are not eligible to apply.
- Applications may be made either online or posted directly to the office by Monday 16th January 2017.

## Achievement Awards 2016 Guidelines

Give your project a title

Make sure that you have answered the following questions

- How did the idea for this project originate?
- What was the objective of the project?
- How long did it take to carry through the project?
- What were the main problems you encountered?
- When was it completed?

Describe as fully as you can

- How far did you succeed in achieving your objective?
- What will be the long-term benefits to your orchestra from the successful completion of this project?

Some examples of suitable projects are:

- A project to develop some part of your youth orchestra or organisation e.g. a recruitment drive for new players or volunteers, or ways in which involvement in the orchestra by players and volunteers is increased or enhanced.
- A project to develop the balance of the orchestra, develop a new section or develop the ability to engage with new / more difficult or different types of repertoire.
- Joint Ventures with other groups, at home and abroad.
- Performances of a particular work or works.
- Fund-raising initiatives the help grow the orchestra in the long term.
- Participation in a particular event.
- Establishing a new resource for your orchestra, e.g., library, newsletter, website
- Commissioning a new work for your orchestra.
- Residencies with artists / composers.

This list is not exhaustive. If you feel your project or development forms a landmark for your orchestra and that you deserve recognition, then contact the office to see if it is eligible.



# File Formats and Submission of Supporting Materials

- Your application form must be in the form of a document: pdf, doc, docx or odt.
- Supporting materials such as DVDs, CDs and photographs can be submitted by post.
- Photos and Press Clippings can also be submitted digitally by email.
- Links to Youtube video or digital copies of media (mp3, mp4) etc can be submitted by email.
- Please Note! Video and audio files should not be included in other files (i.e. PowerPoint)
- No individual email submitted to IAYO should have attachment greater than 10MB. You may send several emails if your total attachments are greater than this.
- Please do not submit email attachments greater than 10Mb.
- Supporting materials must arrive at the IAYO office by the application closing deadline.
